VOLUNTEERS TO BUILD OVER 500 GARDENS May 7 will launch 15-day garden-building event



From Saturday, May 7 through May 21, hundreds of volunteers will join Victory Garden Initiative for the nation's largest garden-building event, the Great Milwaukee Victory Garden BLITZ.

Over these two weeks, volunteers will build approximately 500 4x8' raised-bed gardens filled with healthy, organic soil in locations throughout Milwaukee.

The gardens, bought by community members at an affordable price, are fully installed by volunteers and filled with organic soil from VGI's local compost partner,

Blue Ribbon Organics.

Anyone can purchase a garden for their yard or business, and each year at least half of the BLITZ gardens go to low-income recipients. Registration to purchase a garden is open now until May 1st.

The BLITZ mobilizes over 300 volunteers, who will meet every day at Habitat for Humanity, 3726 N. Booth St., to gather supplies and head out to neighborhoods to start building gardens.

Grant Provides Much-Needed Boost to Wisconsin Homeowners in Danger of Foreclosure Making Home Affordable Program to Sunset

Springboard Nonprofit Consumer Credit Management, Inc. (“Springboard”) announced today that help is available for struggling homeowners in Wisconsin at no cost thanks to grant funding from the National Foreclosure Mitigation Counseling (“NFMC”) Program.

Because 2016 marks the final year for the federally-funded Making Home Affordable (“MHA”) programs, this opportunity addresses an urgent need to connect homeowners with these valuable relief programs before time runs out. To be considered for assistance through MHA, a complete initial package must be submitted on or before December 30, 2016.

Since the housing crisis of 2007, Springboard, a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development approved housing counseling agency and annual recipient of NFMC funding, has provided an invaluable free service to well over 250,000 homeowners and their families. “Foreclosure prevention counseling is a lifeline for homeowners who are experiencing any level of difficulty in making their mortgage payments” says Melinda Opperman, Springboard’s Chief Relationship Officer. “Whether families are about to miss a mortgage payment or are already far behind, Springboard’s counseling delivers support, direct access to available resources, and tangible help to relieve mortgage and other related financial struggles.”

According to RealtyTrac, Racine County is struggling the most with 1 in every 821 homes receiving a foreclosure filing last month. That is 39% higher than the national average of 1 in 1,353. In Milwaukee alone there were 2,880 properties in some stage of foreclosure as of March 28th. While national headlines move away from the devastating fallout of the housing crisis, it is crucial that struggling homeowners are made aware of the resources and programs that are still available.

Early intervention is key to successfully preventing foreclosures, and the sooner a homeowner reaches out – even before missing a payment – the more likely it is that a counselor will be able to help.

Ease into Gardening with a Raised Bed

Raise your garden to new heights for easier access and greater productivity. Raised beds allow you to overcome poor soil by creating the ideal growing mix, plus make gardening time more comfortable thanks to less bending and kneeling.

Whether you purchase a kit or build your own, there are a few things to consider when creating a raised bed garden.

Locate the garden in a sunny area if possible. Most plants require at least six hours of sun, and vegetables like tomatoes, peppers and melons produce best with a full day of sunlight.

Select a long-lasting material such as interlocking block, field-stone, plastic lumber or naturally long lasting wood like cedar.

The material selected will influence the shape and size of your garden. Some materials allow for curved beds while others are limited to squares, rectangles and other angular shapes.

Design your raised bed to fit your space and your needs. A

three- or four-foot width makes it easy to reach all parts of the garden for planting, weeding and harvesting.

Raising your planting bed at least 8 to 12 inches improves drainage and provides an adequate space for most plants to root and grow. If you want to minimize bending, go higher.

Add benches to increase your gardening comfort and ease. Bonnie Plants has free downloadable plans (bonnieplants.com/library) for building a raised bed garden with benches in just one afternoon.

Roughen or loosen the existing soil surface if your bed is built on compact, slow-draining soil. This will allow water to readily move from the raised bed into the soil

below.

Cover the bottom of the bed with newspaper or cardboard, if needed, to suffocate existing weeds and grass.

Line the bottom of your raised bed with hardware cloth to reduce the risk of animals burrowing into your garden.

Lay the hardware cloth over the ground and bend it up along the inside of the raised bed walls.

Fill the bed with a quality growing mix that is well drained but also able to retain moisture and nutrients.

This may be a mixture of quality topsoil and compost, a high quality potting mix, or a planting mix designed specifically for raised bed gardens.

Grow any plants that you normally would grow in ground. Just make sure the plants are suited to the growing conditions (such as sunlight, heat and wind) in your area.

Since the soil mix and drainage is ideal in a raised garden, you will be able to grow more plants per square foot. Just be sure to leave sufficient room for plants to reach their mature size.

Keep your plants healthy and productive with proper watering. This is critical for growing any garden, but even more crucial in a fast-draining raised bed.

The simple act of raising the garden height increases drainage, and a raised bed filled with planting mix means more frequent watering.

Consider using drip irrigation or soaker hoses for watering ease.

Always water thoroughly when the top inch of soil is dry.

Add some mulch to help reduce watering and the need for other garden maintenance.

Spread a layer of evergreen needles, pine straw, shredded leaves or other organic matter over the soil surface.

This helps conserve moisture, suppresses weeds and adds nutrients to the soil as it decomposes. You'll spend less time watering and weeding throughout the season.

Add an organic fertilizer at planting if your planting mix does not already contain one.

Apply again mid-season if the plants need a nutrient boost. Always follow the label directions on the fertilizer container.

The time and effort invested in creating raised beds will be returned many times over with years of healthy and productive gardens.
