

Reverend

DARRYL WILLIAMS

Our clergy are major players in building communities and their ministry to the spiritual, emotional, social and civic life of the church is unparalleled. That certainly has been true with our shepherd, Pastor Darryl Williams, of St. Mark A.M.E. Church, located at 1616 W Atkinson Avenue.

St. Mark AME is an institution on that corner with enviable programs that respond to the congregation and the neighbors who reside near it.

Dating back to 1869, St Mark was the first Black church in the city of Milwaukee. It was first housed in a former Marshall Fields store front and for 30 years, St. Marks AME was the only Black church in Milwaukee.

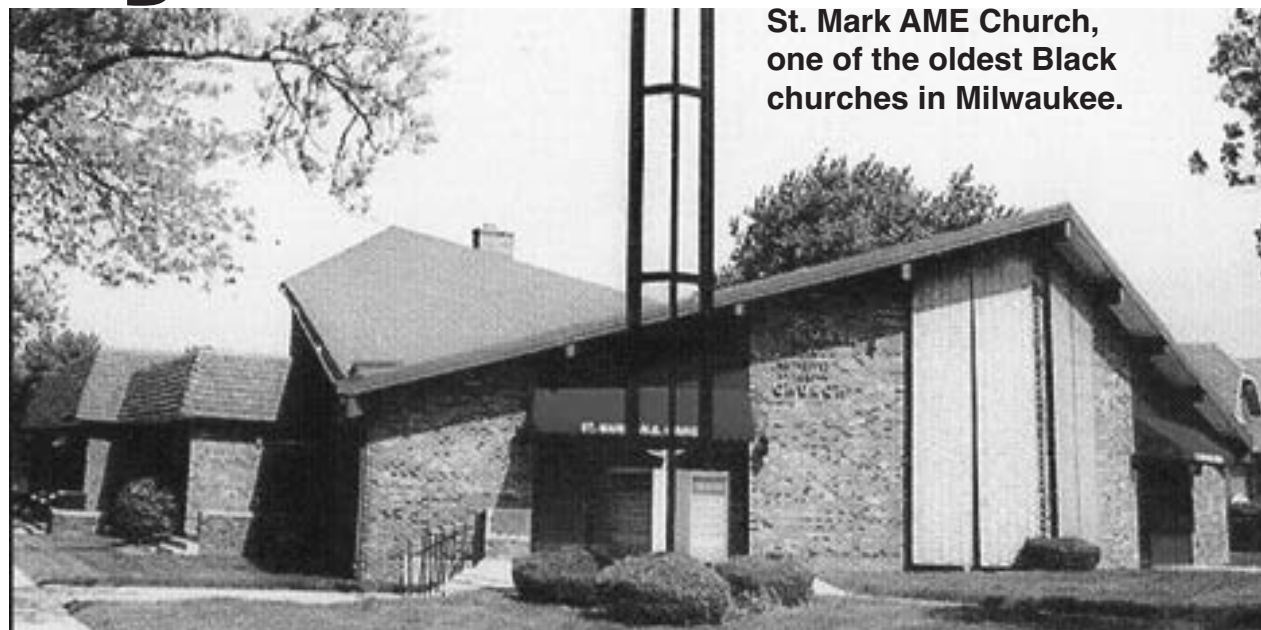
St Mark AME Church was founded by Ezekiel Gillespie, who also sued board of electors of the city for the right to vote in 1865. Born in Tennessee, in 1818, Gillespie bought his freedom from slavery and moved to Indiana before

coming to Milwaukee. He sold groceries and worked as a railroad porter while actively promoting the Underground Railroad that aided Blacks escaping slavery and seeking freedom in the North.

With 147 years of Milwaukee history, Reverend Darryl Williams, St. Mark current pastor, has been a strong minister, educator, community advocate and missionary leader at this impactful religious anchor.

His congregation remains one of the oldest and most established churches with many iconic Milwaukee families.

Throughout, St. Mark has been comprised of Black professionals

who promoted upward mobility and middle class respectability; consistent with the mission of the church. And it leads with that same passion today.

Reverend Williams has been at St. Mark for twelve years, having come to Milwaukee by way of Flint, Michigan; and before that Evansville, Indiana; and before

that Chicago, Illinois, his birthplace.

He comes from a strong African American Episcopal church family. Both his uncle and his maternal grandfather were well respected AME pastors in Chicago.

Reverend Williams was literally born into the African American Episcopal Church and now be-

lieves he is being called to a new ministry within it.

"I love travel, he explained. It has afforded me the opportunity to meet some interesting people, more importantly; it has allowed me to see the various and dire needs of people all across the world.

“It has impressed upon me that my ministry is global. Fulfilling my calling as a Bishop would better match my calling with my interest and passion.

“The Bishop’s work is administrative as well. I would have to match pastors with local congregations in an effort to help those congregations carry out their mission to their communities.

“I hope to be victorious for the office of Bishop because I believe I am ready to teach, preach, to travel, to spread these gifts and graces across the world.” In 2013, Pastor Williams ministered in Lusaka, Zambia. “That was a wonderful experience!”

“I’ve been to Africa four times and India once. In all of these countries, we visit the orphanages, blighted communities, we bring resources, we preach the Gospel we teach,” he shares with enthusiasm.

“The needs are so great. Simple things like toothbrushes and toothpaste, diapers, feminine articles, many of the things we take for granted, are needed and so sincerely appreciated.”

Pastor Williams shares that they are able to see God in the eyes of those they minister to in these countries. It reminds me of the scripture, “As you have done to the least of these, you have done it unto me.”

“St. Mark has been a major con-

tributor to the purchase of supplies through the Williams for Bishop Campaign. And now MCJ readers can help this ministry by contributing, as well.

One certainly selfishly wonders about St. Mark and the outstanding job Reverend Williams has done here.

He is the third pastor since the untimely death of Reverend and Mrs. Lovell Johnson, the historic pastor many old timers remember. Reverend Johnson served for 27 years.

After Reverend Johnson, there was Reverend Robinson from 1991-2001, and Reverend Cousin from 2001 to 2004, so Pastor Williams appointment in 2004, to present, exceeds both prior pastoral appointments.

The appointment to St Mark will be one of the resident Bishops most important. Rev Williams states, “I would hope it is someone who is community focused and socially conscious. That would be consistent with the tradition of St Mark.”

There are over 2 million members, with 6100 pastors and 21

bishops in the World Church. And the church serves in five continents, including South America,

North America Europe, Africa and Asia, so meeting the needs of the flock has broad implications. The African Methodist Episcopal Church is indeed global in scope and membership.

Pastor Williams related, “The 2016 General Conference will probably have about 7000 attendees, from all over the world; with 1800 delegates from 20 districts at the July 6-13, 2016 meeting in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

This will be a major meeting. “In addition to electing Bishops, The denomination will spend most of those days dealing with proposed legislation to govern the church.

Pastor Williams desires that those who know the power of prayer pray with him for the fruitfulness of the Conference and for his elevation.

“I know I desire to help the ‘least of these. I am passionate about being a presence in these areas that so badly need our love and presence. Jesus said go ye and make Disciples all over the world. I want to do just that.”

Continuing he said,” Opportunities abound all over the world. I believe I have been called to make sure the African Methodist Episcopal Church Stays in motion, meeting these needs. When there is no motion, we are static.

That leads to death. If it was

possible to do an autopsy on a church that has died, I am sure the report will read,’ they stopped moving forward and focusing outward.’ “

“I want the Kingdom of God to expand. And it can and it will. It will take people who have the courage, the passion and who are willing to make the sacrifice. I am confident that I fit the bill.”

The AME Church: It's mission and its beliefs...



The 1st African American Church in Wisconsin, founded 1869.

The word African means that the church was organized by people of African descent and heritage.

It does not mean that the church was founded in Africa,

or that it was for persons of African descent only.

AMEThe church's roots is of the family of Methodist churches. Methodism provides an orderly system of rules and regulations and places emphasis on a plain and simple gospel.

Episcopal refers to the form of government under which the church operates.

The chief executive and administrative officers of the African Methodist Episcopal denomination are the Bishops of the church.

The A.M.E. Church Mission

The Mission of the African Methodist Episcopal Church is to minister to the spiritual, intellectual, physical, emotional,

and environmental needs of all people by spreading Christ's liberating gospel through word and deed.

At every level of the Connection and in every local church, the African Methodist Episcopal Church shall engage in carrying out the spirit of the original Free African Society, out of which the A.M.E. Church evolved: that is, to seek out and save the lost, and serve the needy through a continuing program of (1) preaching the gospel, (2) feeding the hungry, (3) clothing the naked, (4) housing the homeless, (5) cheering the fallen, (6) providing jobs for the jobless, (7) administering to the needs of those in prisons, hospitals,

nursing homes, asylums and mental institutions, senior citizens' homes; caring for the sick, the shut-in, the mentally and socially disturbed, and (8) encouraging thrift and economic advancement.

A.M.E. Church Beliefs

The Motto "God Our Father, Christ Our Redeemer, Man Our Brother" is a great summary of what the African Methodist Episcopal Church believes.

Also known as the A.M.E. Church for short, the denomination is Methodist in terms of its basic doctrine and order of worship. It was born, through adversity, of the Methodist church and to this day does not differ in any major way from what all Methodists believe.

The split from the main branch of the Methodist Church was not a result of doctrinal differences but rather the result of a time period that was marked by man's intolerance of his fellow man, based on the color of his skin.

It was a time of slavery, oppression and the dehumanization of people of African descent and many of these un-Christian practices were brought into the church, forcing Richard Allen and a group of fellow worshippers of color to form a splinter denomination of the Methodist Church.

A Brief History of the African Methodist Episcopal Church

The AMEC grew out of the Free African Society (FAS) which Richard Allen, Absalom Jones, and others established in Philadelphia in 1787. When officials at St. George's MEC pulled blacks off their knees while praying,

FAS members discovered just how far American Methodists would go to enforce racial discrimination against African Americans.

Hence, these members of St. George's made plans to transform their mutual aid society into an African congregation. Although most wanted to affiliate with the Protestant Episcopal Church, Allen led a small group who resolved to remain Methodists.

In 1794 Bethel AME was dedicated with Allen as pastor. To establish Bethel's independence from interfering white Methodists, Allen, a

former Delaware slave, successfully sued in the Pennsylvania courts in 1807 and 1815 for the right of his congregation to exist as an independent institution. Because black Methodists in other middle Atlantic communities encountered racism and desired religious autonomy, Allen called them to meet in Philadelphia to form a new Wesleyan denomination, the AME.

The geographical spread of the AMEC prior to the Civil War was mainly restricted to the Northeast and Midwest. Major congregations were established in Philadelphia, New York, Boston, Pittsburgh, Baltimore, Washington, DC, Cincinnati, Chicago, Detroit, and other large Blacksmith's Shop cities.

Numerous northern communities also gained a substantial AME presence. Remarkably, the slave states

of Maryland, Kentucky, Missouri, Louisiana, and, for a few years, South Carolina, became additional locations for AME congregations. The denomination reached the Pacific Coast in the early 1850's with churches in Stockton, Sacramento, San Francisco, and other places in California. Moreover, Bishop Morris Brown established the Canada Annual Conference.

The most significant era of denominational development occurred during the Civil War and Reconstruction. Oftentimes, with the permission of Union army officials AME clergy moved into the states of the collapsing Confederacy to pull newly freed slaves into their denomination. "I Seek My Brethren," the title of an often repeated sermon that Theophilus G. Steward preached in South Carolina, became a clarion

call to evangelize fellow blacks in Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Texas, and many other parts of the south. Hence, in 1880 AME membership reached 400,000 because of its rapid spread below the Mason-Dixon line. When Bishop Henry M. Turner pushed African Methodism across the Atlantic into Liberia and Sierra Leone in 1891 and into South Africa in 1896, the AME now laid claim to adherents on two continents.

While the AME is doctrinally Methodist, clergy, scholars, and lay persons have written important works which demonstrate the distinctive theology and praxis which have defined this Wesleyan body.

Bishop Benjamin W. Arnett, in an address to the 1893 World's Parliament of Religions, reminded the audience of the presence of blacks in the formation of Christianity.

Bishop Benjamin T. Tanner wrote in 1895 in The Color of Solomon – What? that biblical scholars wrongly portrayed the son of David as a white man. In the post civil rights era theologians James H. Cone, Cecil W. Cone, and Jacqueline Grant who came out of the AME tradition critiqued Euro-centric Christianity and African American churches for their shortcomings in fully impacting the plight of those oppressed by racism, sexism, and economic disadvantage.

Today, the African Methodist Episcopal Church has membership in twenty Episcopal Districts in thirty-nine countries on five continents. The work of the Church is administered by twenty-one active bishops, and nine General Officers who manage the departments of the Church.
