#### Chalk Acrylic Paint Desk

Crafting time:  
Weekend project  
Skill level: Beginner

#### Supplies and Tools:

- painter's tape
- FolkArt Home Decor Chalk: Imperial or color of choice
- 2-inch paintbrush
- hand sander and 80 grit sandpaper
- soft cloth
- dark wax

1. Using painter's tape, tape off areas not to be painted. Paint desk. Allow to dry and recoat as needed.

2. When dry, distress edges with hand sander until desired look is

achieved. Using soft cloth, wipe on dark wax and buff.

#### Sitting Pretty Painted Chair

Crafting time: 1-2 hours  
Skill level: Intermediate

#### Supplies and Tools:

- white cotton canvas to cover seat and back of chair
- masking tape in a variety of widths
- Tulip Soft Fabric Paint in Ebony, Crimson Red, Royal Blue and Sunshine Yellow
- foil or foam plate for palette
- paintbrushes
- spray paint in coordinating color
- scissors
- Aleene's Fast Grab Tacky Spray
- Aleene's Fast Grab Tacky Glue
- staple gun and staples
- craft knife
- black trim fabric
- Glam-It-Up! Iron-On Crystals in Clear
- Tulip Cordless Heat Setting Tool

1. Lay canvas flat on work surface. Randomly place a

variety of tape strips on canvas, intersecting strips to create abstract lines and shapes.

2. Fill in open areas between tape strips with fabric colors, using one dominant shade for majority of sections, with other colors as occasional accents. Remove tape and allow fabric to dry.

3. Remove old upholstery from chair. Reserve it to use as a pattern for cutting painted fabric.

4. Spray paint chair base; allow to dry.

5. Cut out painted canvas to fit chair backing and base.

Apply tacky spray to chair base and position painted fabric over base. This will help to hold new fabric in place while gluing and stapling edges. Repeat for chair back.

6. Use tacky glue around the edges of fabric to secure it to chair base and back.

Use staple gun to secure fabric edges on the base

and back for additional security. Trim excess fabric around edges with craft knife. Cover edges of fabric and staples with black trim, secured with tacky glue. Allow glue to dry completely.

7. Cut out heart shape from scrap of painted can-

vas. Cover heart with clear crystals and use heat-setting tool to set crystals in place, following instructions on packaging. Use tacky glue to secure crystal heart to chair back. Allow to dry.

## DIY Burlap Bulletin Board

Crafting time: Varies  
Skill level: Intermediate

## Supplies and Tools:

- 2/3 yard patterned burlap
- unframed cork board
- scissors
- staple gun
- small hammer
- 3/8-inch grosgrain ribbon
- glue dot runner
- high temperature hot glue gun
- chalkboard clothespin clips
- chalkboard clothespins
- thumbtacks
- decorative ribbons and trims, such as chalkboard plaque

## Instructions:

Cut burlap about 5 inches wider and longer than cork board.

Place burlap (pattern down) on a smooth surface and center cork board (face down) on top of it. Wrap burlap around edges of board and staple it to the back using a staple gun, pulling burlap tight as you go. Notch out burlap and staple around it to allow for holes to hang the cork board.

Staple burlap along the length of the board on both sides before working on corners. Then, take a corner piece and pull it tight toward center of the board and staple. If any staples are sticking up, use small hammer to tap in tighter.

Use coordinating grosgrain ribbon to create a decorative border.

Use glue dot runner to apply glue dots to one side of ribbon along a length about 2 inches shorter than cork board. Starting 1 inch in from the edge of the board, lay down glue-dotted ribbon so that it adheres to burlap. At the corner, flip ribbon over and follow same steps for the next side. A small dot of glue from hot glue gun will help keep corners flat and in place.

To personalize and embellish board: hot glue thumbtacks onto back of chalkboard clothespins clips, which won't puncture holes in letters or notes that are attached to the board. Add decorative ribbons and trim that add a unique element and pop of color.

## Wall Organization

Skill level: Beginner

## Supplies and Tools:

- 1 1-inch flat brush
- 1 each Homedecor Chalk Finish • Paint: Teal, Sheepskin, Cascade, Parisian Grey, Oatmeal
- 3 large Woodline Works unfinished crates
- 2 small Woodline Works unfinished crates
- sandpaper

## Instructions:

1. Paint each box a different color and let dry.
2. Paint the box again using a different color than the bottom color and let dry.
3. Lightly to moderately sand each box to expose paint underneath to give each box a distressed look.
4. Using an old rag or soft cloth, rub each sanded box with white wax and let dry. Buff each box to give it a finished look and

# Naturally Clean for Spring

*A surprising way to make spring cleaning simple*

(Family Features) Wiping away the grime of winter doesn't have to mean launching an attack with dangerous chemicals.

As you tackle this year's spring cleaning chores, take a note from Mother Nature and rely on the cleaning power of a surprisingly effective natural product: vinegar. During the last century, vinegar has become increasingly recognized as a low cost and eco-friendly household product. From cooking and canning, to cleaning items indoors and out, homeowners are discovering that this eco-friendly, acetic liquid is as versatile as it is useful.

"Cleaning with vinegar has always been an effective way to banish dirt and grime in kitchens, bathrooms, the garage and the outdoors," said Mike Smith, executive vice president of sales and marketing at Mizkan Americas, the makers of Four Monks Cleaning Vinegar.

Despite its strong cleaning power, vinegar does have one downfall: its distinctive odor. You can experiment with dozens of DIY recipes online to overcome this dilemma, or you can rely on a store-bought non-toxic cleaning vinegar such as Four Monks, which is made from a proprietary

process that reduces the strong aroma and leaves a clean, crisp scent.

## In the Kitchen

Clean off the blades of a well-worn can opener with an old toothbrush soaked with vinegar to help remove dirt and grease.

Clean your ice/water dispenser by running vinegar through the system. Flush the vinegar out by running water through the system for 30-60 seconds.

Rid your dishwasher of mineral buildup by pouring half a cup of vinegar into the reservoir and running an empty cycle. You can also use vinegar in the dishwasher instead of another glass cleaner to keep your glassware sparkling.

Renew sponges and dishrags by placing them in just enough water to cover them. Then add one-fourth cup of vinegar and let them soak overnight.

Remove dark stains on an aluminum pot by boiling two cups of vinegar.

For stained and smelly plastic food containers and lunchboxes, wipe them with a cloth dampened with vinegar.

To clean a grease-splattered oven door window, saturate it with vinegar. Keep the door open for 10-15 minutes before wiping with a sponge.

Deodorize the garbage disposal by pouring in half a cup of baking soda and half a cup of vinegar. Let sit for five minutes then run hot water down the disposal.

Avoid using toxic chemicals where you store food; wipe up spills in the fridge with vinegar.

## In the Bathroom

Rid a faucet of lime deposits by tying a plastic bag containing one-third to one-half cup of vine-

gar around it and leaving it there for two or three hours.

Wipe down with a sponge and scrub any remaining deposits with an old toothbrush. The same approach can be used to remove buildup on a showerhead.

The fizzing combo of vinegar and baking soda can unclog and remove odor from a tub drain. Pour half a cup of baking soda in the drain, then follow with two cups of hot vinegar. Immediately plug the drain with a rag to keep the bubbles contained for 10 minutes.

Rinse by pouring a kettle of boiling hot water down the drain.

Spray shower doors with vinegar after you've squeegeed the glass – or before you turn on the water – to help release hard water deposits.

Clean shower door tracks by filling them with vinegar and letting it sit for a few hours. Pour hot water into the tracks and scrub away any remaining film with a toothbrush.

To make the toilet bowl sparkle, pour in a cup or more of vinegar and let it sit for several hours or overnight. Scrub well with the toilet brush and flush.

Remove old bathtub decals with vinegar heated in the mi-

crowave.

## In the Laundry Room

Remove coffee and tea stains by flushing the area with vinegar, rinsing and repeating. For wine stains, saturate the spot with vinegar and allow it to stand for several minutes. Then, wash as normal.

Tip: For more delicate fabrics or precaution, test on an inconspicuous part of the garment first.

Restore yellowed clothing by soaking garments overnight in a solution of 12 parts warm water and one part vinegar. Wash them the following morning.

Soak new garments in a few cups of vinegar for 10-15 minutes before washing to stop dyes from running in the wash.

If frequent ironing has left your iron plate dirty, make a paste from one part vinegar and one part salt to scrub it clean.

Remove scorch marks from an iron by rubbing it with a warm solution of equal parts vinegar and salt. If that doesn't work, use a cloth dampened with vinegar.

Forgot that you left wet laundry in the machine and it now smells moldy?

Pour a few cups of vinegar in the machine and wash the clothes in hot water. Then run a

normal cycle with detergent to rinse the clothes.

Prevent lint from clinging to clothes by adding half a cup of vinegar to the wash cycle.

## What Is Vinegar?

Vinegar is the acetic liquid that results when a product containing sugar is allowed to ferment. Vinegar can be created from nearly any product containing sugar; fruit and grains, such as barley and corn, are common sources of vinegar.

The ingredients in vinegar depend on the type of vinegar produced. For example, Four Monks uses distilled vinegar processed from corn, so it's safe for your family. All vinegars are diluted with water to the preferred acidity before bottling. Four Monks has 6 percent acidity, which is 20 percent stronger than traditional vinegar, but gentle on everyday surfaces.
