Over the next week, volunteers will frame five new homes and rehab three others as they kick off the build season.

The homes are located near 31st Street and Garfield Avenue. More than 350 volunteers will work on the homes that will be completed over the next year.

One of the new homeowners is Renee Robinson.

"It's overwhelming to see something come from just a poured foundation into a house that I will make into a home," she said.

Robinson said it wasn't until she saw the work getting done Tuesday that she felt she could finally call herself a homeowner. She is a mother of six with two young children still living at home. She works at a jewelry store and says she assumed she would rent forever.

"I've been through some things in my life," she said. "Each year it gets better and better and now the good Lord has blessed me

Bucks, Johnson Controls announce major investment at Westlawn Gardens

The Milwaukee Bucks are partnering with Johnson Controls to construct a \$150,000 multi-sport complex at Westlawn Gardens' Browning Elementary School and the Silver Spring Neighborhood Center.

The announcement was made recently, and according to Alderman Cavalier Johnson, the new complex will include multiple basketball courts, a 200 meter track, playing fields, and other amenities. Additionally, the Bucks and Johnson Controls will also donate \$60,000 annually for the next 10 years toward community programming at Browning, 5440 N. 64th St., and the Silver Spring Neighborhood Center, 5460 N. 64th St.

"The Milwaukee Bucks are demonstrating that their commitment to our community goes far beyond the cranes in the sky downtown, and Johnson Controls continues to be a valued corporate citizen in our community," Alderman Johnson said.

"The students served at Browning Elementary School, the Silver Spring Neighborhood Center, and the residents of the greater neighborhood are thankful and appreciative of this wonderful commitment that will benefit Milwaukee's youth and young adults," he said. "My great thanks to the Bucks and Johnson Controls for their tremendous contribution to the neighborhood."

The complex is set to be completed by the start school this fall.

WHEDA Awards Five Milwaukee Projects \$3.3 Million in Low-Income Housing Tax Credits

26 projects expected to create more than 1,300 affordable housing units statewide

Wisconsin Lieutenant Governor Rebecca Kleefisch recently announced the award of more than \$13.6 million in Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) to fund affordable housing developments across Wisconsin.

The tax credits, which are distributed by the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA), will move forward 26 developments that will create 1,367 units of affordable rental housing.

Lt. Governor Kleefisch made the announcement in Milwaukee at the future site of the National Soldiers Home Residences on the grounds of the Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center.

Just under \$1.4 million in Low-Income Housing Tax Credits were awarded to the project that will renovate the "Old Main" Building into 72-one bedroom and 8 two-bedroom apartment units for veterans and their families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Onsite

Carson Must Answer Questions on Devastating Cuts to Affordable Housing

On Thursday, June 8, HUD Secretary Ben Carson testified on Trump's HUD budget in front of the House Appropriations Committee, here is a look at some of the many devastating cuts to affordable housing for low-income Americans that he had to defend:

Trump's budget would eliminate the \$3 billion block grant program which funds affordable housing construction and local improvement projects in more than 1,000 cities.

Washington Post: "The largest of Trump's \$6.2 billion in proposed cuts to HUD is the elimination of the four-decade-old Community Development Block Grant program, which provides cities with money for affordable housing and other

community needs, such as fighting blight, improving infrastructure and delivering food to home-bound seniors.

The \$3 billion in block grants, which benefit 1,250 state and local recipients, make up half of the cuts to HUD."

Trump wanted to slash a host of programs that provide rental assistance and affordable housing for low-income Americans.

Politico: "Rental assistance to tenants would fall by \$974 million, to \$19.3 billion, with the elimination of a housing program for veterans and reduced spending on Section 8 and other voucher programs. Capital funding for public housing would fall by two-thirds."

Politico: "The document also zeros out Choice Neighborhoods revitalization grants and the HOME Investment Partnerships Program, which leverages private funds to expand the supply of affordable housing."

Washington Post: "In addition to shuttering the grant programs, the budget proposes cutting the \$37 billion rental assistance program by \$2 billion through policies that encourage work and self-sufficiency, including increases to tenant rent contributions," the document said.

Rental reforms for 2018 would include raising tenant rent contribution from 30 percent of adjusted income to 35 percent of gross income, establishing a minimum rental payment of \$50 a month and eliminating utility reimbursements. Exemptions would be made for hardships."

Under Trump's budget, an estimated 250,000 households could be at risk of homelessness

Washington Post: "HUD's rental assistance programs provide housing subsidies for 4.5 million low-income households through vouchers, public housing or rental assistance for specific housing developments.

The rental programs make up 85 percent of the agency's \$41 billion budget request.

More than 250,000 households are at risk of losing their vouchers, [Diane Yentel, president of the National Low Income Housing Coalition] said, increasing their exposure to evictions and homelessness."

supportive services will be provided for veterans living at Soldiers Home.

"These critical tax credits are instrumental in building strong neighborhoods through the effective combination of affordable housing and economic development," said Lt. Governor Kleefisch.

"I'm especially thrilled that the all Soldiers Home development will create stable housing for our outstanding veteran heroes."

"I'm gratified at the ongoing devotion and commitment of Wisconsin's development community to provide safe, quality housing options," said WHEDA Executive Director Wyman Winston.

"The tax credit program is one of the state's most successful and effective public-private partnerships. The Soldiers Home project truly symbolizes the standard of excellence we see in all the award winners today."

"The Alexander Company is proud to have been chosen to rehabilitate these historic buildings, which are such a significant piece of the social fabric of Milwaukee, the State of Wisconsin, and the

nation," said Joe Alexander, President of the Alexander Group that is the project developer. "With the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit Program, our public-private partnership will be able to restore these buildings to their original purpose – the service of our nation's veterans."

In addition to the renovation of "Old Main," the "Headquarters" Building will be converted into single room occupancy units, which will provide housing for 14 homeless or at-risk veterans. Adjacent areas will be renovated into common kitchen, dining, community and living rooms.

The historic post office on the first floor will be reused as supportive program offices. Community and activity areas for supportive services will be housed on the building's ground level. Several duplexes on the grounds will also be restored for use as veteran housing.

Renovation of "Old Main" is expected to be complete by March 2019. The conversion of the "Headquarters" Building is expected to be complete by April 2019.

WHEDA has awarded more

than \$3.3 million to five Milwaukee developments: National Soldiers Home Residences (\$1,396,561), Westlawn Renaissance III LLC (\$1,009,508), Mill Road Library Redevelopment (\$805,063), Century Building (a prior awardee that received an additional credit of \$43,793), and 704 Place Apartments (a prior awardee that received an additional credit of \$76,078).

WHEDA received 43 applications this year representing \$25.48 million in requests, demonstrating the highly competitive nature of the federal tax credits.

The tax credits will help finance affordable housing units in communities in Calumet, Dane, Dodge, Douglas, Grant, Iowa, Kenosha, La Crosse, Milwaukee Outagamie, Portage, Racine, Rock, Sauk, St. Croix, Winnebago, and Wood counties.

Tax credits are awarded over a ten-year-period through the federal housing tax credit program. The 2017 awarded tax credits are worth more than over \$136 million over their 10-year lifespan. In exchange for receiving the tax credits, developers agree to reserve a portion of their housing units for low- and moderate-income households for at least 30 years.

Remaining units are rented at

market rates to seniors and families without income limits.

Tax credit developments must meet high design and operating standards.

Criteria include strong management, excellent development quality, demonstrated market need, provision of services and amenities, proper local zoning and permits and service to households at various income levels.

"Low-Income Housing Tax Credits stimulate significant economic activity in Milwaukee and all across Wisconsin totaling millions of dollars," said WHEDA Executive Director Wyman Winston. "The credits attract private equity capital for rental housing production of the highest quality standards."

WHEDA has been the sole administrator for LIHTCs in Wisconsin since the federal program began in 1986.

Since 1986 WHEDA has awarded nearly \$342 million in LIHTCs resulting in the development and rehabilitation of more than 53,000 units of rental housing for low- to moderate-income families, seniors and persons with special needs.

Robinson also had the chance to meet Braun and Garza who offered her congratulations on her new home.

Both players donned hard hats and picked up hammers to contribute to the builds.

The Brewers Community Foundation is the presenting sponsor of the June Blitz Build and has partnered with Habitat since 2006.

According to the organization, since Habitat began focusing on the Washington Park neighborhood, crime has decreased by nearly 50 percent on the blocks where they built Habitat homes.

More than 220 Habitat families live in the neighborhood now.

Over the next year, 35 new families will receive homes or home repairs.

**PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF COMPLETION OF TWO NATIONAL OUT-OF-HOSPITAL CARDIAC
ARREST RESEARCH STUDIES IN MILWAUKEE COUNTY**

Two national research studies on the effect of uninterrupted chest compressions (CCC) cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) versus chest compressions with interruptions for ventilations (30:2) CPR and the effect of the heart medications amiodarone or lidocaine on survival after out-of-hospital cardiac arrest have been completed in Milwaukee County.

About the research

These studies were performed by the Resuscitation Outcomes Consortium (ROC) - a collaboration of 10 U.S. and Canadian sites that perform emergency research. A total of 26,148 patients were enrolled in the CPR study, and a total of 3,026 patients were enrolled in the heart medication study. Milwaukee County was one of the ROC sites where Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services and the Medical College of Wisconsin performed this research.

Of the 26,148 patients enrolled nationwide in the CPR study, 2,129 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee County between February 2012 and May 2015. 1,296 patients (61%) were male and 833 (39%) were female. 1,041 patients (49%) were Caucasian, 676 (32%) were African-American, 34 (2%) were Asian, 6 (less than 1%) were Alaskan Native/American Indian, 1 (less than 1%) was Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, and 371 (17%) were unreported race. 85 patients (4%) were Hispanic.

Of the 3,026 patients enrolled nationwide in the heart medication study, 354 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee County between January 2013 and October 2015. 265 patients (75%) were male and 89 (25%) were female. 191 patients (54%) were Caucasian, 122 (34%) were African-American, 10 (3%) were Asian, 1 (less than 1%) was Alaskan Native/American Indian, and 30 (8%) were unreported race. 8 patients (2%) were Hispanic.

Study Results

The CPR study found no significant difference in survival to hospital discharge for patients who received CCC compressions (9.0%) compared to those that received 30:2 compressions (9.7%). The study also found no significant difference in survival with favorable outcome between patients in the two treatment groups.

The heart medications study found no significant difference in survival to hospital discharge for patients who received amiodarone (24.4%) or lidocaine (23.7%) versus placebo (21.0%). The study also found no significant difference in survival with favorable outcome between patients in the three treatment groups. Patients who received amiodarone or lidocaine had about the same amount and type of side effects as the patients who received placebo.
