## African Americans are living longer, but health disparities remain

For decades, research has documented a number of disturbing racial disparities in health care, including higher death rates among African-Americans than whites.

While that's still true today, new government data shows some significant improvements.

According to a report released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in 2017, the age-adjusted death rate among African-Americans declined 25 percent from 1999 to 2015. However, although blacks as a whole are living longer, their life expectancy is still four years less than whites and critical racial disparities still persist between the two races, researchers say.

"We have some good news here today," Leandris Liburd, Ph.D., M.P.H., M.A., the associate director of CDC's Office of Minority Health and Health Equity, said in a press briefing.

"Death rates for blacks have declined substantially in the past 17 years. The CDC sees this as a move in the right direction, although we recognize that there

are still gaps in those achievements."

Racial disparities in all age groups are narrowing because death rates are declining faster among blacks than whites, the data showed.

The overall disparity in rates for all causes of death between these two races in all age groups fell from 33 percent in 1999 to 16 percent in 2015. This racial gap closed completely for deaths from heart disease and for all causes of death in those aged 65 and older.

However, of particular concern, the researchers found that African Americans in their 20s, 30s, and

40s are more likely to live with or die from health conditions that typically occur at older ages in whites, such as heart disease, stroke, and diabetes.

Risk factors for these chronic diseases, such as high blood pressure, may go unnoticed and untreated for years, the researchers point out. This can lead to an earlier death.

Previous studies have also noted that death rates have been rising for middle-aged white Americans, in large part due to the toll of the opioid epidemic.

When it comes to the death rate from homicide, the lead author of the CDC report, epidemiologist Timothy Cunningham, Sc.D., emphasized that there was no improvement over the 17 years of the study.

"Homicide is the seventh highest cause of death among blacks and has not decreased to major extent in any age group other than 65 and older," he said in the press briefing.

It remains the leading cause of death in blacks ages 18 to 34 and the third leading cause of death in those age 35 to 49, Cunningham said.

Additionally, the report shows that blacks ages 18 to 34 are nine times more likely to die from homicide as whites in the same age group. In the 35- to 49-year-old age group, the rate for blacks is five times higher than whites.

One more positive area was improvements in

## STUDY: Blacks and Whites Differ in Their Willingness to Participate in Health Research Studies

Racial and ethnic minorities, especially African-Americans are significantly less likely to participate in health-related research than whites, says a new study from Ball State University.

This impedes the testing, development, implementation, and evaluation of various clinical and community based disease prevention and health promotion interventions, said

said Jagdish Khubchandani, a community health education professor in Ball State's College of Health and author of the study Black-White Differences in Willingness to Participate and Perceptions about Health Research.

The research, which was recently published in Journal of Immigrant and Minority Health, examines health research participation history and willingness to participate.

"According to the findings, lesser-educated, older, and male African-Americans are less likely to participate in health research studies," Khubchandani said.

"It could be possible that this generation of older African-American males still experiences prejudice or is highly aware of the past exploitation of racial and ethnic minorities in healthcare research and healthcare systems."

Researchers found that about 15 percent of African-American respondents have participated in a health research study and 48 percent would participate in a health research study if invited.

While more than a fifth of

whites (23 percent) have participated in a study, majority would like to participate if invited (57 percent).

"Trust building should be a key component of healthcare professional training and prac-

tice," he said "If individuals do not want to participate in health research studies, it becomes difficult to find better care or disease prevention methods."

Community members ages 18 years or older enrolled in HealthStreet, an innovative community engagement research program comprised the source of study population. A total of 7,809 community members (58.6 percent females) participated in the study with 65.8 percent African-Americans and 34.2 percent whites.

The study also found:

Older African-American males with lower education are the least likely to participate in health research studies.

The amount of fair compensation desired by African-

Americans to participate in health research studies was two times higher than Whites.

Individuals who are unemployed, food insecure, and chronically ill are more likely to volunteer for health research studies.

Those who have participated in health research studies in the past, are more likely to be willing to participate again, if invited to participate

"Healthcare practitioners need to ensure beneficence, justice, and respect for all.

While billions of dollars are spent every year due to existing health disparities, these disparities can be reduced by better research and including racial and ethnic minorities as a key component of all healthcare initiatives from government to consumer preference"

HIV/AIDS. The data showed an 80 percent drop in HIV deaths among 18- to 49-year-old African-Americans from 1999 to 2015. Dramatic decreases in HIV deaths were also seen among whites, but a wide disparity remains with blacks seven to nine times more likely to die from HIV.

social and economic conditions, including poverty and access to health care, contribute to the disparities seen in the report.

According to the study, African-Americans in all age groups had lower educational attainment and home ownership and nearly twice the rate of poverty and unemployment as whites.

The report calls for public health agencies and community organizations to come together and implement programs focusing on preventive health measures to help reduce racial health gaps, such as healthy eating, physical activity, quitting tobacco use, dis-

ease screenings, and sticking to prescribed medication.

Other sectors of the community — including education, business, transportation and housing — can also do their part to create social and economic conditions that promote health starting in childhood, the

researchers say.

"It is important that we continue to create opportunities for all Americans to pursue a healthy lifestyle," Cunningham said. "Public health professionals must work across all sectors to promote health at early ages."

## High Blood Pressure: Using the DASH Diet

The DASH diet focuses on foods that are high in calcium, potassium, and magnesium. These nutrients can lower blood pressure.

Taking calcium, potassium, and magnesium supplements doesn't have the same effect as eating foods that are high in those nutrients.

Don't make big changes in your diet all at once. Make small changes, and don't give up. As soon as those changes become habit, add a few more changes.

You'll have more success if you make a plan that includes long-term and short-term goals as well as ideas for getting past barriers—things that might get in the way of changing your eating habits.

Support from family and friends can go a long way toward helping you find success in changing your habits. Don't be afraid to let family and friends know what you're trying to do. And ask for their help.

### How can you make DASH a habit?

#### Setting goals

You'll have more success in changing your eating habits if you make a plan. The plan should include long-term and short-term goals as well as ideas for getting past barriers—things that might get in the way of changing your eating habits.

What is your long-term goal? A long-term goal is something you want to reach in 6 to 12 months. When you have high blood pressure, the long-term goal is to lower your blood pressure and lower your risk of health problems caused by high blood pressure. Your doctor will give you a blood pressure goal. An example is to keep your blood pressure below 140/90.

What are the short-term goals that will help you reach your long-term goal? Short-term goals keep you going day to day. They are usually goals you hope to reach tomorrow or next week.

Look at the DASH eating plan. Come up with a short-term goal that looks pretty easy. For example, you might decide that your first short-term goal will be to eat 4 servings of vegetables every day. As soon as you've made those extra vegetables a habit, you can add another short-term goal.

#### Eating with DASH

Here are some ideas for eating with the DASH plan:

Drink fat-free milk. A glass of fat-free milk has only 80 calories and no fat. It's packed with nutrients that lower blood pressure. Have a "skinny" latte (made with fat-free milk) as a way to add milk to your diet. If you don't drink coffee, try a skinny steamed milk or chai drink.

Make a baked potato bar. Serve baked potatoes with a variety of vegetables, such as broccoli. And use other toppings, such as low-fat shredded cheese, chili, salsa, and refried beans. If you use toppings from a can or jar, be sure to choose low-sodium varieties. Or even better, make them yourself from fresh ingredients. Be creative. You could end up with 4 or 5 servings of vegetables at one meal.

Eat a variety of cut-up vegetables with a low-fat dip such as hummus. Try some new vegetables. Make a stir-fry with lots of different vegetables.

Buy a vegetarian cookbook, and try one recipe each month or each week.

Add garbanzo beans (chickpeas) to a salad, use fat-free refried beans, and/or make split pea or black bean soup.

Combine a ready-made pizza crust with low-fat mozzarella cheese and lots of vegetable toppings. Use tomatoes, zucchini, spinach, carrots, cauliflower, and onions.

For breakfast, have whole-grain cereal, fruit, and low-fat or fat-free milk.

Take fruit to work or school as a snack.

Make a dip for fruit from low-fat or nonfat vanilla yogurt and cinnamon. Many people find that it helps to write down everything they eat every day. That way they can easily see how much of each food group they've eaten and where they need to add or cut back tomorrow.
